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## Letter from the Director

*It is with great pleasure that I present to you the Arkansas State Board of Nursing's 2011 Annual Report. This report reflects the Board of Nursing's activity from July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011.*

*The mission of the board of nursing is to protect the public and act as their advocate by effectively regulating the practice of nursing. The Arkansas State Board of Nursing is composed of 13 board members. In accordance with state statutes, there are seven registered nurses (RNs) on the board. Of these seven RNs, one is an advanced practice nurse with prescriptive authority; two have (as their highest educational preparation) a diploma, two have an associate degree and two have a baccalaureate or higher degree in nursing. There are four licensed practical or licensed psychiatric technician nurses and two consumers, one of which represents the elderly population. The agency consists of an administrative staff of 27 hard working and dedicated individuals.*

*The Board is involved in nursing regulation on the local, state and national levels in order to address the ever-changing needs of the citizens of Arkansas. The annual report reflects the myriad of activities conducted by the Board and its staff in their commitment to fulfilling the mission of public protection. As you read this report, I hope that you find the information informative and useful.*

## INTRODUCTION

The Annual Report of the Arkansas State Board of Nursing is prepared and distributed in accordance with the *Nurse Practice Act* of the State of Arkansas, Arkansas Code Annotated, § 17-87-203(4). It contains information regarding the Board's activities, as well as information about nurses licensed by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing, organized by licensure type and county of residence. Data on the supply and distribution of nurses licensed is included in Appendix B of this report. This data is obtained from responses during license renewal.

## GOAL STATEMENTS

We, the Arkansas State Board of Nursing, will:

- Aim to identify our overall broad goals, in the context of protecting the public.
- Conduct our business by focusing on our identified goals, being open to new ideas and speaking with one voice after decision-making.
- Relate to our staff, committees and constituents through clear policies and criteria and empowering people to manage themselves.
- Evaluate our performance by focusing on results accomplished.
- Maintains an office for the administration of its business and employs personnel necessary for carrying out its functions; examines, licenses and renews licenses or certificates of duly qualified applicants for nursing licensure and medication assistant certification;
- Prescribes minimum standards, approves curricula, surveys and approves educational programs preparing nurses for nursing licensure and medication assistant certification;
- Promulgates rules necessary for the implementation of the Act and submits these to the Arkansas legislative bodies for review;
- Develops and recommends role levels of technical classes of nursing service and practice to state and federal health agencies and to public and private administrative bodies;
- Conducts disciplinary proceedings and causes prosecution of persons violating the Act; and
- Grants certificates of prescriptive authority to qualified advanced practice nurses.

## MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the Arkansas State Board of Nursing is to protect the public and act as their advocate by effectively regulating the practice of nursing.

## BOARD FUNCTIONS

The Arkansas State Board of Nursing has a legislative mandate to protect the public by assuring that any person practicing nursing is qualified to do so. The current law governing the Board of Nursing is covered under the *Nurse Practice Act* of the State of Arkansas (reprinted from Arkansas Code Annotated, § 17-87-101 - § 17-87-711). In keeping with the power and responsibilities in the *Nurse Practice Act*, the Board:

In the past year the Arkansas State Board of Nursing met three days for business sessions, one day for strategic planning and fourteen days for disciplinary hearings. Board members and staff participated in nursing education advisory group meetings, regional and national meetings of the National Council of State Boards of Nursing; consulted with nursing education programs, health care agencies, other governmental agencies; and met with professional nursing organizations.

The Board complies with the Arkansas Freedom of Information Act and informs the news media of dates and times of all meetings. All Board deliberations and meetings are open to the public except matters that involve personnel or test information covered by security agreements. Accomplishments of note for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011 include the following:

- Conducted continuing education workshops titled "NURSING TODAY: Ethics, Leadership, Social Networking and More" at various locations around the state
- Coordinated the sixth annual continuing education cruise for nurses from 11 states
- Co-sponsored the eighth annual Nursing Expo with employees and educators to address the nursing shortage
- Authorized the scholarship awarded through the ASBN Nursing Student Loan Program be named the Faith A. Fields Nursing Scholarship Loan
- Approved the American Association of Critical Care Nurses Acute Care Practitioner Examination for Certification
- Approved the American Association of Critical Care Nurses Clinical Nurse Specialist - Neonatal Examination for Certification
- Received a check for \$27,569 for the Faith A. Fields Nursing Scholarship Loan Fund from the non-operational Arkansas Nursing Workforce Center
- On July 1, 2011, the ASBN began using a cardless licensure system
- Elected officers for 2010-2011: President - Brenda Murphree, RN; Vice president - Gladwin Connell, Rep. of Older Population; Secretary - Karen Holcomb, RN; Treasurer - Cynthia Burroughs, Consumer Representative
- Participated in the Celebrate Nursing Week and announcement of the 2010 Compassionate Nurse Award at the ThinkNurse Expo
- Approved the revision of ASBN International Application Instructions to be consistent with CGFNS in requiring a score of 83 on the Test for English Foreign Language (TOEFL) Internet based examination
- Approved the reconvening of a task force to discuss Chapter 6 *Rules* distant learning
- Participated in Nurse's Day at the Capitol
- Approved a task force to discuss Chapter 6 *Rules* regarding the issue involving PN required contact hours
- Approved revisions to Position Statement 98-1, Administration of Analgesia by Specialized Catheter (Epidural, Intrathecal, Intrapleural)
- Conducted a Directors of Nursing Continuing Education Workshop

# Budget

The Arkansas State Board of Nursing does not receive appropriations of general revenue from the state. Nurse licensure fees constitute the agency’s primary financial support. The FY 2011 total revenue was \$2,675,647.64. Expenses for the fiscal year totaled \$2,611,264.63. Total revenue and expenses includes Board of Nursing operating fund, nursing student loan fund, continuing education workshop fund and criminal background check fund.

The Board is required to pay 1.5 percent of revenue fees to the Treasury of the State of Arkansas. These funds are credited to the State’s General Fund for appropriation to various other agencies and services of state government. The Board paid \$36,848.01 to the General Fund for FY 2011. The financial statements and graphs on the following pages reflect the breakdown of revenue and expenses for the fiscal year 2011.

The Nursing Student Loan fund, titled the Faith A. Fields Nursing Scholarship Loan, is a separate fund used only for the purpose of providing loan/scholarships to nursing students and nurse educator students. The program is funded by donations that are deposited into the designated fund. From these funds, nursing students are awarded loans that can become scholarships if they work in the state of Arkansas for one calendar year after graduation and licensure.


The Continuing Education fund is also a separate fund that allows the Board of Nursing to collect registration fees for the educational workshops provided by the Board of Nursing. The designated funds from the registration fees are used to offset the costs associated with providing this service.

The Criminal Background Check fund is a separate cash fund the Board uses to collect and submit payments for the federal and state criminal background checks for applicants and employees. This fund was established to allow ASBN to run the background checks online. Online processing shortens the time to receive the results and speeds the application process.

The ending balance in the operating fund as of June 30, 2011 was \$2,773,094.02. The balance in the NNB (Continuing Education Workshop) Fund was \$39,151.52. The balance in the NNB (Nursing Loan) Fund was \$446,008.47. The balance in the NNB (Criminal Background Check) Fund was \$7,138.56.






### Percentage Graph of Budget Used For FY2009 - FY2011



## INCOME GRAPH July 2010 - June 2011




## EXPENSE GRAPH July 2010 - June 2011



# Nursing Discipline

The Arkansas *Nurse Practice Act* (NPA) and its *Rules* provide that the Board may deny, suspend, revoke, limit or otherwise discipline any license to practice nursing or certificate of prescriptive authority for certain causes. These causes include: (1) is guilty of fraud or deceit in procuring or attempting to procure a license to practice nursing; (2) is guilty of a crime or gross immorality; (3) is unfit or incompetent by reason of negligence, habits, or other causes; (4) is habitually intemperate or is addicted to the use of habit-forming drugs; (5) is mentally incompetent; (6) is guilty of unprofessional conduct; (7) has had a license, certificate, or registration revoked, suspended or placed on probation or under disciplinary order in any jurisdiction; (8) has voluntarily surrendered a license, certification, or registration and has not been reinstated in any jurisdiction; or (9) has willfully or repeatedly violated any of the provisions of any chapter of the Arkansas NPA. The Arkansas NPA further provides that the Board shall refuse to issue or shall revoke the license of any person who is found guilty of or pleads guilty or nolo contendere to any offense listed in §17-87-312(e).

Inquiries and reports to the Board concerning safety in individual nursing practice continue to increase. Investigations of these inquiries and reports are completed by Board staff, legal counsel, contract investigators or other governmental agencies. During its investigations, the staff has continued to emphasize the Board's commitment to the due process afforded each licensee under the provisions of the Arkansas NPA and the Administrative Procedures Act as well as the Board's charge to protect the public. During the reporting period, 1790 cases were opened, 362 cases were pending and 1744 complaints were closed. At the end of the reporting period 56 cases were awaiting hearings and 98 cases were awaiting consent agreements.

# Disciplinary Action by the Board of Nursing

One of the methods used by the Board of Nursing to insure protection of the public is to cause the prosecution of persons violating provisions of sections 17-87-101 through 17-87-402 of the Arkansas *Nurse Practice Act*. The following is the order of disciplinary proceedings against nurses in the state of Arkansas:

## IF DISCIPLINARY ACTION IS PURSUED, THIS CAN BE ACCOMPLISHED IN ONE OF TWO WAYS:

### CONSENT AGREEMENT

The Board staff determines the violations and proposed stipulations. Board Attorney draws up a legally binding agreement.



The licensee receives a copy of the Agreement, agrees to the terms, including waiving their right to a hearing before the Board, signs the agreement, and returns it to the Board office. (If the licensee refuses to sign the agreement, the Disciplinary Hearing process begins.)



Board attorney and a staff witness sign the Consent Agreement and forward it to the Board.



Board President signs the Consent Agreement following a majority approval by the Board.

### DISCIPLINARY HEARING

The General Counsel files formal charges. This may be done initially or after the licensee refuses a Consent Agreement.



#### Disciplinary Hearing is Held

If the Board finds the nurse violated the *Nurse Practice Act*:



Disciplinary Order  
The Board issues an Order setting forth the discipline. (reprimand, probation, suspension, revocation or limitation)

If the Board finds that the conduct which was charged did not occur or that the conduct which did occur is not a violation of the *Nurse Practice Act*, the case is dismissed and no further action is taken.

The Order becomes effective the day it is signed.



#### Appeal

The licensee may appeal this decision to the circuit court of the county in which he or she resides or the Circuit Court of Pulaski County, AR.

# Licensure

The *Nurse Practice Act* requires that any person practicing as a(n)

- Registered Nurse
- Advanced Practice Nurse
- Registered Nurse Practitioner
- Practical Nurse, or
- Psychiatric Technician Nurse

in this state shall be licensed by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing. Legislation enacted in 1979 authorized the licensing of registered nurse practitioners. Act 409 of 1995 created advanced practice nurse licensure. This licensure includes the previous categories of certified registered nurse anesthetist and certified nurse midwives and adds licensure of advanced nurse practitioners and clinical nurse specialists. Appendix B gives totals of nurses licensed in Arkansas by licensure category and county of residence. The information is derived from those questions that are completed on the licensure renewal forms. Incomplete data indicates that the licensee did not provide that information.

## Examinations

Licensure examinations for registered nurse and practical nurse candidates are administered via computerized adaptive testing. State boards of nursing contract with the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) for these examinations. In Arkansas, tests are administered by technology centers located in Little Rock, Fort Smith and Texarkana. A candidate may test at any center nationwide or internationally for licensure by the Board that provided authorization to test.

The licensure examinations have one purpose: to test knowledge, skills and abilities essential to the safe and effective practice of nursing at the entry level. The use of national RN and PN examinations facilitates licensure by endorsement from one jurisdiction to another. The passing standard is set by a panel of practicing nurses who are knowledgeable of entry-level nursing practice. Membership on the panel is open to all NCSBN jurisdictions. Examination results are reported to boards of nursing and to the candidates as either “pass” or “fail”. Unsuccessful candidates are provided with a performance report that gives information on areas for remedial study.

The Board participates in the test development system administered by the testing service of the NCSBN. The Arkansas Board approves practicing nurses to participate in RN and PN item writing, item review, and standard-setting panels.

Graduates of an approved nursing program are eligible for licensure in Arkansas after passing the National Council Licensure Exam (NCLEX®). The number of registered nurse and licensed practical nurse licenses issued by exam is shown in the following table:

## Endorsements

Pursuant to the Arkansas *Nurse Practice Act*, the Board may issue a license to practice nursing by endorsement to an applicant who is duly licensed as a nurse under the laws of another state, territory or foreign country if the applicant meets Board qualifications. Applicants for endorsement must have successfully completed a nursing education program, the appropriate NCLEX®, and must be verified by the jurisdiction of original licensure. In addition to these requirements, advanced practice nurses shall have documentation of current unencumbered advanced practice license/authority to practice in another jurisdiction. Nurses licensed in Arkansas by interstate endorsement from each state during the reporting period (July 1, 2010 – June 30, 2011) are identified below:

## Medication Assistants - Certified

Act 1423 of 2005 gave the Board authority to grant certification to qualified unlicensed persons to administer certain medications in facilities determined by the Board. The Board decided to allow medication assistants only in Arkansas nursing homes in which nursing supervision is available and nurse patient ratios are legislatively required. This authorization included persons who have met certain qualifications in Arkansas or who have met substantially similar qualifications and held similar credentials under the law in another state. In addition, in 2007, persons who have completed a certain portion of a nursing education program may be eligible to take the certification exam and work as a certified medication assistant if successful. The table below lists the numbers of medication assistants granted certification in Arkansas during the reporting period.

## Renewals

The *Nurse Practice Act* requires biennial license renewal for practicing nurses. Renewal reminders are mailed at least thirty days before the license expiration date. Nurses who allow their licenses to lapse and who have not practiced nursing during the preceding licensure period may be reinstated upon request, payment of the renewal fee and late penalty, and after meeting the continuing education requirements. Nurses who do not renew are in good standing as long as they do not practice nursing in Arkansas. Legislation to require continuing education prior to license renewal was passed in the 2001 Legislative session.

## Temporary Permits

# Nursing Education

Continuing education for license renewal and reinstatement was mandated by Act 86 of the 2001 Arkansas legislative session. The regulations were put into effect beginning July 1, 2003. Random audits for compliance with the continuing education requirements are conducted each month. Three hundred five (305) nurses were audited with a 91.4% compliance rate. Twenty-four Letters of Warning were issued for meeting the continuing education requirements after the nursing license was renewed. Three Letters of Reprimand were issued for failing to meet the continuing education requirements.

The Arkansas State Board of Nursing approves programs preparing registered nurse and practical nurse candidates for licensure. The *Nurse Practice Act* requires that the Board prescribe minimum standards, approve curricula and survey educational programs through its authorized representative. During the reporting period, four registered nurse and four practical nurse programs were surveyed. Curriculum consultation and lectures by Board staff were provided to nursing education programs throughout the state.

Federal and Arkansas criminal background checks are required of all individuals applying for an initial license in Arkansas. During the 2010-2011 fiscal year, approximately 4,819 Arkansas criminal background checks and 4,855 federal criminal background checks were entered into the board's database. There were 1,390 investigations completed on applicants with a positive criminal background check.



## Loans and Scholarships

In 2009, Act 9 was passed which authorized additional funding for the nursing student loan program. To be eligible for the loan, the applicant must be an Arkansas resident enrolled in an accredited nursing program leading to qualification as a registered nurse, licensed practical nurse or nursing educator. Each scholarship recipient may be awarded up to \$20,000 which is disbursed over multiple semesters. During the past fiscal year, ASBN has awarded \$127,400 in scholarship funding to eligible students.
